## EVEN THE STONES WILL SING!

I always think of Palm Sunday as a day of celebration and happiness, a kind of dress rehearsal for Easter. As a child, I remember the day and its story of a palm parade with all its enthusiasm and excitement. When you think of a parade you probably have in mind Savannah's great spectacle for St. Patrick—with a caravan of colorful floats and high stepping bands. In contrast, the parade in Jerusalem on that holy day was barely noticeable in some respects.

Jerusalem probably saw fewer parades than we do, and I suspect that the one we remember today was barely noticeable in some respects. The streets of the Old City are so narrow, the gates so cramped. It was more like an impromptu protest march. Luke tells us Jesus came to town riding on a donkey. It was not meant to be flashy and polished. In some ways it was more like enacting a church play hastily thrown together and written by the prophet Zechariah. "Your king comes to you, triumphant and glorious, riding on a donkey." And Jesus fulfilled this prophecy. The words the crowds say are scripted too, lifted from Psalm 118. "Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord.Hosanna, save us, we beseech you."

Expectations were running high that day among the crowds, but the way Luke tells the story there is a sub-theme as well, an under-plot that overlays the events of that day. Coming to Jerusalem was risky—both the religious hierarchy and the Roman authorities were uneasy about anything that would upset the status quo in Palestine.But at this point, Jesus is a man determined. He has a cause and becomes a cause that is the salvation of the world.

On the day that Jesus rode into Jerusalem, his disciples shouted their welcome and praise, and had they been silent, Luke remembers Jesus saying even the stones would have cried out. As he made his way into the city and faced crowds who greeted him with palms and hosannas, he knew that at that very moment in some carpenter shop in a military barracks, crossbeams were already being hewed and nails already being forged. The crowds will soon shout, "Crucify!" and another injustice, the greatest injustice of this world will be done.

Add your voice to our Palm Sunday hosannas and plan on staying for the congregational luncheon. Then join us the following days as we remember the solemn events of Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. Return on Easter when there will come another shout, a joyful expression of resurrection, the life-transforming truth that rings through the centuries after the stone is rolled away from the tomb.

So we come home, you who are weary and carrying such heavy burdens that you never stop to rest. Come home, you who are bright and energetic, who have your life ahead of you, challenged by all that is coming your way. Come home, you who are young and worried what life will bring, discouraged that whatever it is you are supposed to have you don't have enough of it. Come home, you who are facing illness, struggling with pain, unsure which is worse, the disease or the treatment. Come home, you who are getting older feeling as if life is passing you by and there is not much joy left in life. Come home, you who are walking the valley of the shadow of death and feeling alone.

God has been this way, walked our journey, known our life, carried our sorrows, forgiven our failures, faced even the worst the world can do and has triumphed victoriously. For our sake, and for our salvation, Jesus enters Jerusalem this Palm Sunday, into the city where he will die and, behold, on the third day rise again! Come home this holy week to hear the message that God is love and nothing can separate us from that love, ever. --SCW
