UNLESS THE LORD BUILDS THE HOUSE...

In 1 Kings 6:1 the Bible says that "King Solomon began to build the house of the Lord..." According to the Jewish historian Josephus, the date was April or May of 957 B.C., and the place was Jerusalem. It took seven years to complete and although the temple was destroyed by the Babylonians in 587 B.C., rebuilt several times over and then finally knocked down by the Romans in 70 A.D., for more than a millennium, Israel's house of worship stood as a symbol of God's glory and as a sacred place where people found a sense of God's presence. It is believed that when the temple was dedicated, King Solomon offered up in gratitude those words that are now found in Psalm 127: "Unless the Lord builds the house, those who build it labor in vain."

That is a good text for us to remember as we gather Sunday, June 4 to celebrate the organizing of First in 1827. We are here to offer praise and thanksgiving to God—this is God's church and not ours. If we ever lose sight of that purpose, our efforts and all of our worship, work and witness will be in vain. But if we continue to focus our hearts and minds and lives on God, our ministry will be faithful and blessed. So it has been since the Georgia Presbytery granted a petition on June 6, 1827 to organize our congregation.

In those early years, we met in a public hall called the Lyceum before erecting a church structure on Broughton Street. As the congregation started to grow, we moved to Monterey Square, but construction was halted during the Civil War and the gothic-style structure finally was dedicated in 1872. It was in that sanctuary that the denomination held two General Assembly meetings, including the noteworthy, "Calvin Assembly," celebrating the 400th anniversary of John Calvin's birth in 1909.

The congregation moved to Ardsley Park in 1927 where our campus of buildings slowly grew to include the education building, a stately sanctuary, Stewart Hall and the preschool wing along with guest quarters called Imlay House. This Sunday, we will rejoice as the community of faith that calls this place home and thank God for our life together.

Think of our congregation and imagine all the baptisms, confirmations, funerals and wedding celebrations, the worship services, the fellowship meals and mission projects and the Sunday school classes, the prayers offered and the hymns sung. So this Sunday, let us gather and thank God for the firm foundation we have been given and rededicate our lives to the Lordship of Jesus Christ who is the Head and Cornerstone of this church. And a future stretches before us where new horizons of gospel service beckon. And let us never forget, "Unless the Lord builds the house, those who build it labor in vain!" --SCW



FOUNDERS' DAY CELEBRATION

SUNDAY, JUNE 4

Don't sit on the sidelines when we celebrate our annual Founders' Day on Sunday, June 4! There will be a bagpipe procession, a hymn by noted hymn writer Lowell Mason, an all-church photograph on the plaza followed by a watermelon reception on the church lawn. During the reception there may be a surprise visit by Rev. David Porter. Porter was our minister from 1855-1872, although he was away during the Civil War serving as a chaplain. During worship we will sing Porter's hymn, "Praise Jehovah, Praise Jehovah!" which was written on the occasion of the dedication of the sanctuary on Monterey Square.

WHO IS LOWELL MASON?

A HYMN IN HIS HONOR

Lowell Mason was an influential teacher and choral conductor, whose hymn tunes are still widely sung. He established music teacher training and public school music in Massachusetts. He wrote or arranged nine hymns that are included in our present Glory to God hymnal, including "O for a Thousand Tongues to Sing," and "Joy to the World." Mason served as choirmaster at Independent Presbyterian Church for about ten years before becoming one of First's charter members in 1827 where he served on the Session. We will sing one of his hymns on Founders' Day.

UPDATE FROM THE FACILITIES TASK FORCE

Dear Members and Friends of First,

The Session, at its April stated meeting, appointed a Facilities Task Force (1) to prepare a comprehensive needs and condition assessment of our 40,000 square foot campus of buildings, furniture, fixtures, and equipment, (2) to prepare a master utilization plan as a guide for the future, and (3) to prepare a prioritized plan to address present deficiencies and future modifications. Task Force members are: Josh Brooks, Jordan Chase, Carter Eagle, Gay Mayfield, Eric McManus, Nan Taylor, and myself. Non-voting members are Stephen Williams, Minister, Allison Shearouse, Director of Christian Education, and Jeff Lewis, Director of Music.

The work is underway; we have already met three times and plan to meet every two weeks for the foreseeable future. We are presently in the process of preparing a list of needs and changes to consider. We recognize that completing this task will require a lot of time, hard work, dedication, and patience; and we are committed to the task. As we proceed, we remember that our church property is a gift from God for our use in God's service.

Stay tuned. We will keep you posted as we go, and bear in mind that completing this task will probably take a long time.

Your suggestions are welcomed and will be appreciated. So will your prayers. We are in the process of planning small group meetings in the future where you will have the opportunity to express your ideas.






